## 2018 Activities

During the past year we have provided our three JROTC detachments and our NNDCC unit with unprecedented financial support, helped send more of our area vets to Washington, D.C. on Honor Flight Syracuse, assisted fellow veterans in the Rome Veterans Council, the Viet Nam Veterans Association and the Rome Marine Corps Association with their fundraisers and programs. Wreaths Across America in Rome on December 15, 2018

The Greater Rome Utica Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America continues participation in the Wreaths Across America (WAA) tribute to deceased veterans. Remembrance wreaths will be placed on veterans' graves at Rome Cemetery, St. Peter's Cemetery, St. Mary's Cemetery, St. John's Cemetery, Evergreen Cemetery, and Westernville Cemetery on December 15, 2018 following short ceremonies commencing at Noon.

Local participants in the ceremonies are: school choruses, students, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, JROTC cadets from RFA and Proctor High School, Civil Air Patrol Cadets, Patriot Riders, confirmation classes from St. Peter's and St. John's churches, St. John's Youth Group, business volunteers, State and Municipal elected officials, local musicians, EADS Color Guard, various veteran organization Color Guards. It is the GRUCMOAA mission to involve as many of our local youth as possible.

Last year six cemeteries participated, GRUCMOAA was able to honor 1,300 veterans with a remembrance wreath. A brochure for each cemetery was prepared identifying the military exploits of several of the veterans honored.

Raising over \$5,000, this fundraiser ensures GRUCMOAA can continue to support the JROTC scholarships given at RFA, Proctor, Notre Dame, and now at Central Valley Academy; to finance summer training at Newport, RI for JROTC cadets, and to sponsor local veterans on both Syracuse Honor Flights to Washington, D.C. GRUCMOAAs community involvement and the 5-star Level of Excellence rating from MOAA would not be possible without the WAA program. The number of current dues paid members has decreased year over year, despite our efforts to contact members via email, postal mail, and phone contact.

■ To have another successful year, we encourage members to step up and support this program again either as a volunteer during the fundraising months of June to November or to purchase wreaths when you send in your Pearl Harbor Day dinner request. Help is needed soliciting local businesses to sponsor wreaths, distributing flyers around town announcing the event, seeking individual sponsors, getting organizations and individuals to participate in the ceremonies, and by making

- brochures for each cemetery. All of this is currently done by just a few members. Special thanks to our president Joe Maurer for taking over the helm this year after our Treasurer's tragic road bike accident.
- Solicitation letters on Chapter letterhead are available to anyone interested in being involved recruiting businesses or individuals. We prefer that requests are made in person. Contact GRUCMOAA Treasurer Bob Haley if you can help in any way, or have suggestions on local businesses that may be willing to participate.
- For our members still actively working, if you participate with a donation, please check with your employer. They may offer matching funds for your contribution.
- Contributions to date have been received from: Stewart's Shops (\$750), Wal-Mart Distribution Center-Marcy (\$2,000), Sears Foundation (\$450), Strong —Burns & Sprock Funeral Home (\$250), Rome Teachers Credit Union (\$150), and Cathedral Corporation (\$100).


- The treasury began 2017 with \$10,231.60. Current balance on October 31, 2018 is \$7,328.01.

# Tenney Sends Letter to Senate Veteran's Affairs Committee, Urging the Passage of Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Legislation

September 30, 2018: Earlier this week, Tenney sent a letter to the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee urging the consideration of <u>H.R. 299</u>, the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act. This legislation expands benefits for Vietnam Blue Water Navy Veterans who are currently suffering from diseases they received as a result of their service. This measure has received support from various veteran's organizations including the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), Fleet Reserve Association, Military-Veterans Advocacy, Inc., and the Blue Water Navy Association.

On June 25, 2018, the House of Representatives passed H.R. 299 and sent the legislation to the Senate for further consideration.

The 22nd District is home to more than 55,000 veterans, and it is Tenney's top priority to ensure they receive access to high-quality care. During the Vietnam War, more than 20 million gallons of the herbicide 'Agent Orange' was sprayed to remove jungle foliage, causing health complications for Blue Water Navy Veterans. In 2002, the VA stopped giving benefits to those veterans, causing significant complications for our nation's heroes. Tenney urged the Senate to pass this key legislation, ensuring the coverage our veterans deserve is restored.

As a member of the State Assembly, Tenney sponsored a bill to allow the Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA) to be recognized as a benevolent order and has continued her strong advocacy for our Vietnam Veterans throughout her time in Congress.

# Tenney Sends Letter to Department of Defense Asking them to Allow Veterans Access to Fitness Facilities like the Colosseum Gym

September 30, 2018: On Tuesday, Tenney sent a letter to the Secretary of Defense, James Mattis and the Secretary of the United States Air Force, Heather Wilson, urging the DoD to use its authority to examine a regulatory change to once again allow veterans access to fitness facilities like the Colosseum Gym.

Earlier this year, Tenney introduced <u>H.R. 5130</u>, the Ensuring Access to Military Facilities Act of 2018. This legislation would fix a 2013 change in policy that excluded veterans and military retirees from fitness facilities located on civilian sites, like the Colosseum Gym in Rome at the former Griffiss Air Force Base.

The 22nd District is home to more than 55,000 veterans, and it is Tenney's top priority that we continue to support them after retirement by providing access to facilities like the Colosseum Gym. Since 2013, veterans and retired military personnel have been denied access to the fitness facility at Griffiss and unfortunately, the issue has been ignored by our federal representatives in the past. Veterans have sacrificed to serve our nation. Tenney urged Secretaries Mattis and Wilson to examine this issue, and if possible through their authority implement a regulatory fix to open the doors to our veterans once again.

Tenney's legislation was included in the House version of the NDAA as an amendment, but despite our advocacy and work in attempting to ensure its inclusion in the Senate bill, the Senate failed to include this important provision in the final version.

In July, Tenney sent a letter to Chairmen Thornberry and McCain and Ranking Members Smith and Reed as well as the members of the NDAA Conference Committee urging the committee to include her amendment in the final Senate version.

# Tenney Votes for FAA Reauthorization Act, Now Headed to President's Desk

September 30, 2018: On Wednesday, Tenney voted for H.R. 302, the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018. This bipartisan bill is a five-year reauthorization for the Federal Aviation Administration and includes investments in airport infrastructure, promoting traveler safety, and strengthening customer service. It provides certainty and provisions to expand unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) in the United States. It also includes the Disaster Recovery Reform Act (DRRA) to help communities lessen the impacts of future disasters of all types.

In April, the FAA Reauthorization Act passed the House. It was then sent to the Senate where they made changes and sent it back to the House. It is now headed to the President's desk.

The 22nd District is home to Rome Lab, Griffiss International Airport and the Greater Binghamton Airport, and this legislation will keep us at the forefront of aviation through advancements in aviation technology including measures to develop drone research. Additionally, our region has experienced unprecedented flooding and the DRRA would significantly aid our preparation and recovery efforts. It will provide greater focus on pre-disaster mitigation in order to lessen the impacts of future disasters.

# Tenney Participates in Service Academy Night at OCC

September 30, 2018: On Thursday, Tenney's office joined Senator Gillibrand and Representatives Katko and Stefanik's office at Onondaga Community College to host Service Academy Night. Students from across the 22nd District attended this great event. As the mother of a 2013 Naval Academy graduate, Tenney knows how life changing and fulfilling attending a service academy can be. Our region has a long tradition of service to our great nation and the service academies provide a unique opportunity for those looking to continue this important legacy. #### **VA CLINIC ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS**

In the past year we increased our Rome VA Clinic volunteer force from 2 to 3 chapter members. Together, we have made a big impact at the clinic which regularly serves over 7,000 veterans. Our team enrolls veterans in various on-line programs designed to give them personal control over their health care. Our Chapter's success in this effort has been so outstanding that we are the only volunteer clinic team, among the 7 in the Syracuse, NY VA Hospital Area, authorized to enroll veterans in "Veler", a program that allows electronic exchange of veterans' health data between the VA and private providers.
